

What is LeoSpot?

LeoSpot is the wireless portal to the Internet at your Cumberland County Public Library & Information Center (CCPL&IC). CCPL&IC provides unlimited usage free of charge to its customers, and the configuration necessary is minimal. So just come in, connect, and surf with ease!

What do I need to connect?

Any Wi-Fi enabled device can connect you to LeoSpot. If it says 802.11b, 802.11g, or 802.11n, you should be good to go.

Is the LeoSpot network secure?

No. The library's wireless network is not secure. Information sent from or to your laptop can be captured by anyone else with a wireless device and the appropriate software. We encourage users to observe standard security practices in relation to passwords and credit cards. The library is not responsible for any losses.

Can I print?

No. Printing is not currently available from the wireless network.

Can I connect to my corporate VPN in addition to the Internet?

Yes. In some cases however, you may need to contact your corporate VPN administrator.

How fast is the Wi-Fi network?

Up to 100 Mbps.

Is the Wi-Fi network filtered?

Yes. CCPL&IC provides Internet access in compliance with federal regulations. If you believe that a site is blocked in error, please inform the library staff.

Locations

Seven Cumberland County Public Library & Information Center locations offer free LeoSpot Wi-Fi. (The Law Library does NOT offer LeoSpot Wi-Fi.)

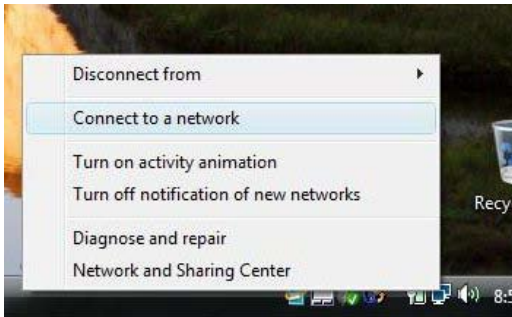


Setup Instructions

Basic instructions for connecting to the Wi-Fi network

Windows Vista

1. Make sure your Wi-Fi software and card are properly installed.
2. Right-click your “Network Connection” (see figure).

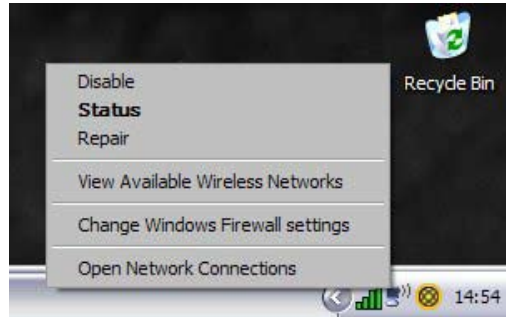


3. Select “Connect to a network”.
4. Select “tsunami” Wi-Fi network, and then “Connect”.
5. Open your Web Browser and start surfing the Web!



Windows XP

1. Make sure your Wi-Fi software and card are properly installed.
2. Right-click your “Wireless Network Connection” (see figure).



3. Select “View Available Wireless Networks”.
4. Select the “tsunami” Wi-Fi network, and then click “Connect”.
5. Open your Web Browser and start surfing the Web!

MacIntosh OS X

1. Select the AirPort icon, and then select Turn AirPort On.
2. Select “tsunami” from the list of available networks.
3. Pop-up Window: “Do you want to automatically join the wireless network named LeoSpot in the future?” Select Yes.
4. Open your Web Browser and start surfing the Web!

Equipment

My device isn't Wi-Fi enabled. Is there anything I can do?

Wi-Fi 802.11b/g/n wireless adapter cards are available at most electronics retailers for both laptops and most PDAs.

What technologies are NOT compatible with Wi-Fi and wireless hotspots?

BlueTooth, PCS Vision and Ricochet cards are NOT compatible with our Wi-Fi network.

Note: While some cellular phones (such as the iPhone) are Wi-Fi enabled and compatible, the standard cellular signal used for conversations and text messaging is not.

Troubleshooting

- Most issues can be resolved by a simple restart of the device.
- Your wireless network card must be set to “DHCP” or “Obtain IP address automatically”.
- For complex issues relating to your Wi-Fi card and its configuration software, consult your owner's manual or contact your manufacturer's support Web site and/or customer support directly.
- Once you do connect, click the “Connection Tips” link on the LeoCat splash page for additional configuration resources for future reference.
